Day Camp Theme Weeks: While the main Day Camp program stays the same each week, we offer Horse Lover's themed weeks, Horse & Small Animal Care themed weeks, and Wild West Week. Campers ride Western style, Monday through Thursday, for approximately 45 minutes (weather permitting). The length of riding time on Friday depends on the theme activities. Theme week descriptions are listed below. For girls ages 10-14 that have attended camp with us, we offer our Equestrian Program in August.

Horse Lover's (girls only & co-ed) -- In addition to daily riding, we have fun for the horse-crazy kids in your family! Activities include mounted games, trail rides (weather permitting), special horse care classes, horse crafts, and a mini-horse show.

Horse & Small Animal Care (co-ed) -- For your animal lover we will have goats and a variety of other special guests brought to you by our Hoofbeat staff. Activities Include: riding daily, trail rides (weather permitting), horse care classes, and special animal care classes.

Wild West Week (co-ed) In addition to our regular activities, we will have a rodeo, Western riding events, campfire, capture the flag, and a wild west dress up day.

Equestrian Program (girls ages 10-14) This program is open to girls ages 10-14 that have previously attended Hoofbeat summer camps. Campers will have two mounted sessions a day, special horse science lessons, trail rides (weather permitting), bareback riding (riding without a saddle), and mounted games.

Weekly activities include a trail ride (weather permitting), horse care classes, crafts, sports, and nature studies along with special activities relating to the theme for the week. While riding, campers must wear S.E.I. approved helmets, boots with a raised heel and smooth sole, and long pants. We have riding boots that your child may use at no additional charge if they do not have their own. In the event of inclement weather (heavy rain, excessive heat, etc.) we may have to substitute other activities in place of horseback riding.

Riding Helmet Options: Helmets are an important part of safety when horseback riding. If you own a helmet it can be used if it is an S.E.I. approved helmet. Bike or other helmets cannot be used. An option we offer is helmet rental at \$10/session. Helmets are fitted and labeled with the camper's name so they have exclusive use of it during the week. **Please reserve one prior to your child coming to camp.** We also sell helmets at camp for \$45 (tax included). If you choose to buy one, the staff will help fit one to your camper the first day of their camp session.

Important Information About Day Camp

To register: Return your application with a \$75 deposit for each session you wish to register for. The deposit will be applied to the total camp fee. You can register online from our website (www.hoofbeat.org). Applications are accepted on a first - come basis. Sorry, we cannot take phone registrations. A confirmation will be emailed to you after your application is received. **Please register only one camper per application and please note that we have a five week limit per camper.**

Session changes: A \$20 rescheduling fee will be charged for each session change. Session changes must be in writing and may be emailed to us. The fee charged for the new session will be the rate currently in effect.

Refunds and cancellations: The deposit is **not refundable** and cannot be transferred to other day camp sessions. No part of your camp fee will be refunded if your cancellation is received less than 4 weeks prior to coming to camp or if a session is cancelled after June 1st. Camp fees are not refundable for early departures.

When sessions are full: Typically sessions begin to fill around mid-January. Our website information may not be updated daily, but the online registration site will indicate whether or not sessions are full. If the session you want has filled, you may request to be placed on our waiting list.

When is the total payment due? The total payment is due April 15th. If registering after April 15th, full payment is required.

May my child be grouped with a friend? Part of an enjoyable camp experience is making new friends. We find that when children come to camp with large groups of friends, it is difficult to make new friends with other campers. **For this reason, we limit the number of group requests to only 1, and they must be the same age.**

Casts, splints, etc.: Children with casts, arm or leg splints, etc. will not be permitted to ride. Any camper that has had a concussion, injury, or surgery within 6 months of coming to camp is required to provide a written release from their doctor for horseback riding and full participation in activities.

Weight Limit: For the safety of our horses, riders, and staff, we have a 200 pound weight limit for riders.

The bus will pull up along the sidewalk in front of the doors on the Mineral Point side of the parking lot. / ****Cross Plains** - Pick - up in front of Cross Plains Storage and drop - off across the street from Cross Plains Motors on Bourbon Road**

Parents MUST supervise their children until the bus arrives each morning and be on time for the bus return in the afternoon.
